

Visitor and service provider information concerning the Corona pandemic (COVID-19 / SARS-CoV-2)

In the interest of general health care, visitors and service providers in the Industrial Park Kalle-Albert are expected to comply with the distancing requirements as well as the hygiene and protective measures recommended by the Robert Koch Institute. These include especially keeping a distance of at least 1.5 m to other people, refraining from shaking hands, sneezing and coughing in the crook of the arm and frequent and thorough washing of hands. You can find more details on this at www.rki.de. Please also observe the signs in the industrial park.

Admission to the industrial estate is subject to the presentation of the self-declaration for visitors and service providers, which you can find online at www.infraserv-wi.de or receive from your host or client by e-mail on request.

Please also note special regulations like the official work safety standards <u>SARS-CoV-2-Arbeitsschutzstandard</u>* as well as additional pandemic measures of on-site companies who have invited you or to whom you are providing services. To avoid, for example, that certain buildings cannot be entered, please ask your host or client in advance about these regulations.

Wearing Mouth-Nose Protection (MNP)



As part of the gradual easing of measures to limit the corona pandemic, the wearing of mouth-and-nose protection (MNP) is required in the industrial estate,

- if a minimum distance of 1.5 m to other persons cannot be maintained when visiting or carrying out work;
- if customers, clients or hosts expressly demand that MNP be worn.

Visitors and service providers are generally obliged to carry their own MNP with them in the industrial estate in case it is required. It is highly recommended that MNPs be worn when using vehicles in the industrial estate with several persons.

Please bear in mind that an MNS does not protect the carriers but the persons opposite if the minimum distance cannot be kept for technical reasons.

All other occupational health and safety regulations, including the necessary PPE, such as the wearing of FFP2 masks in certain working areas, continue to apply unchanged.
